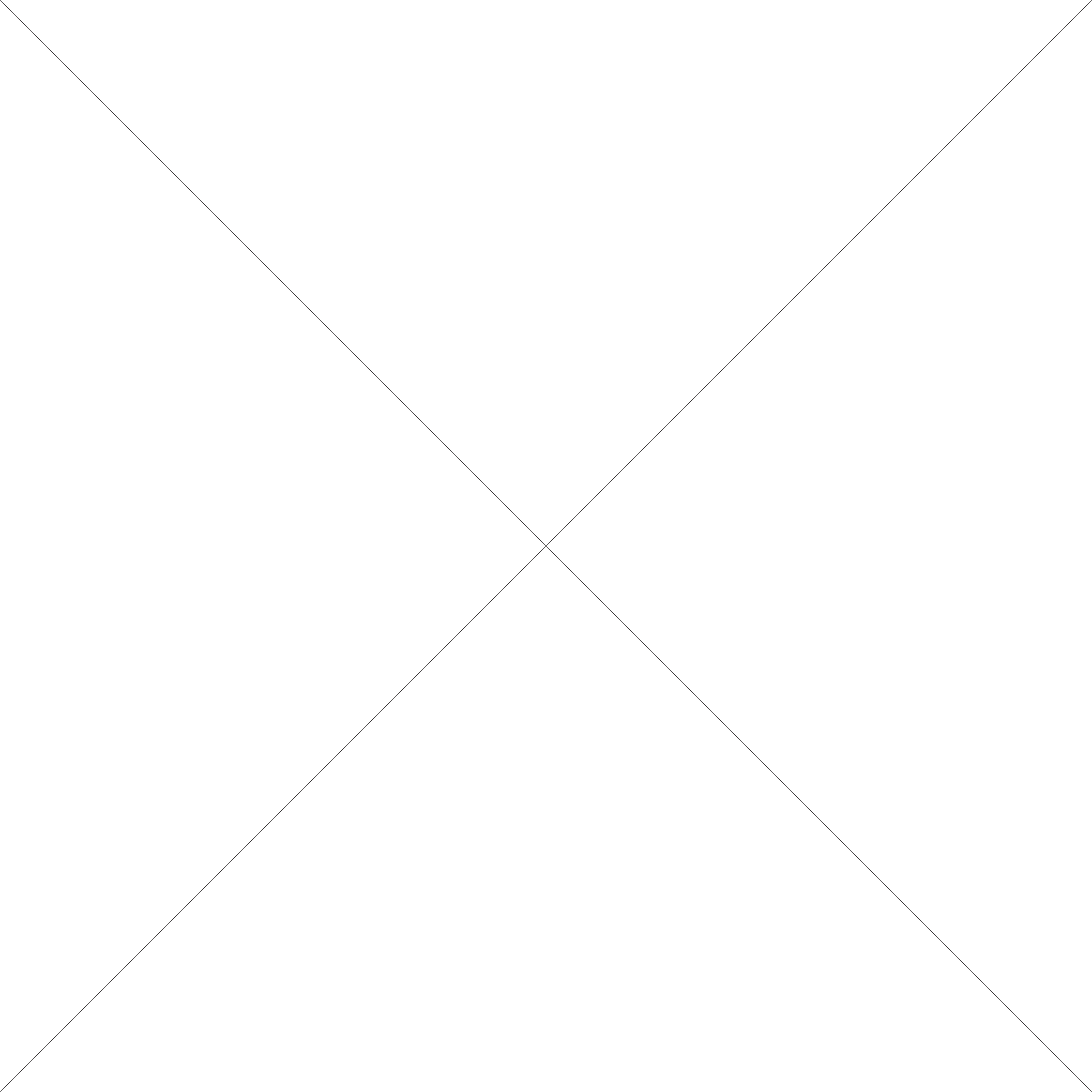

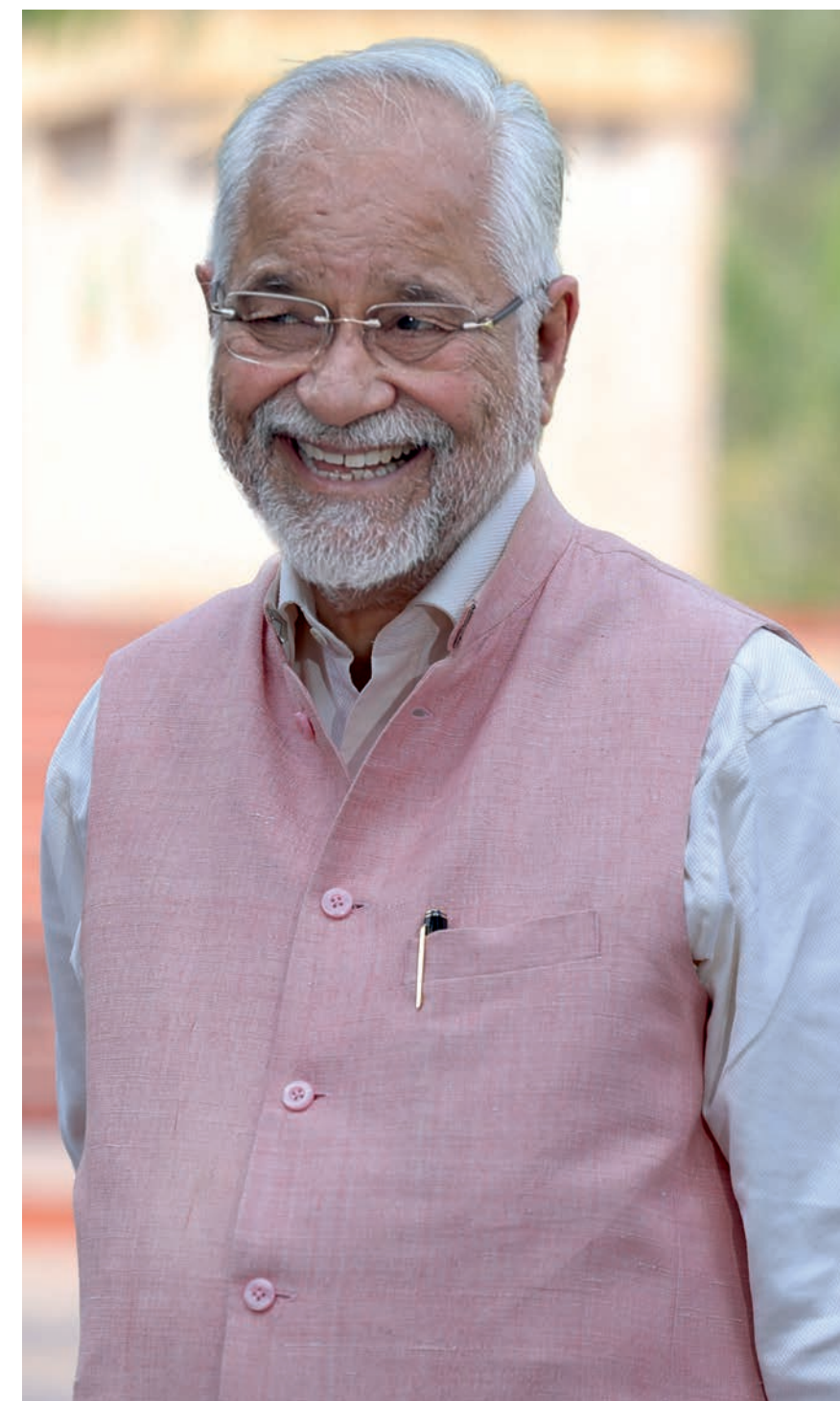

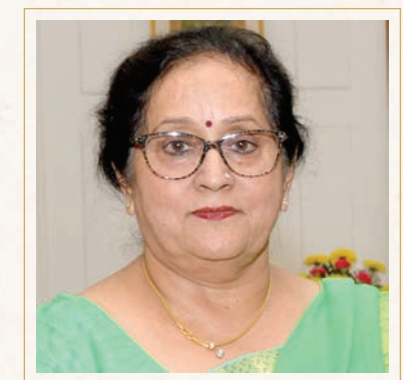

The 20th batch of AISSCE, comprising 50 students, passed with an impressive average of 85.15%, showing an exceptional performance. While the school achieved a 100% pass result, 47 students achieved a distinction above 70% out of the total 50. 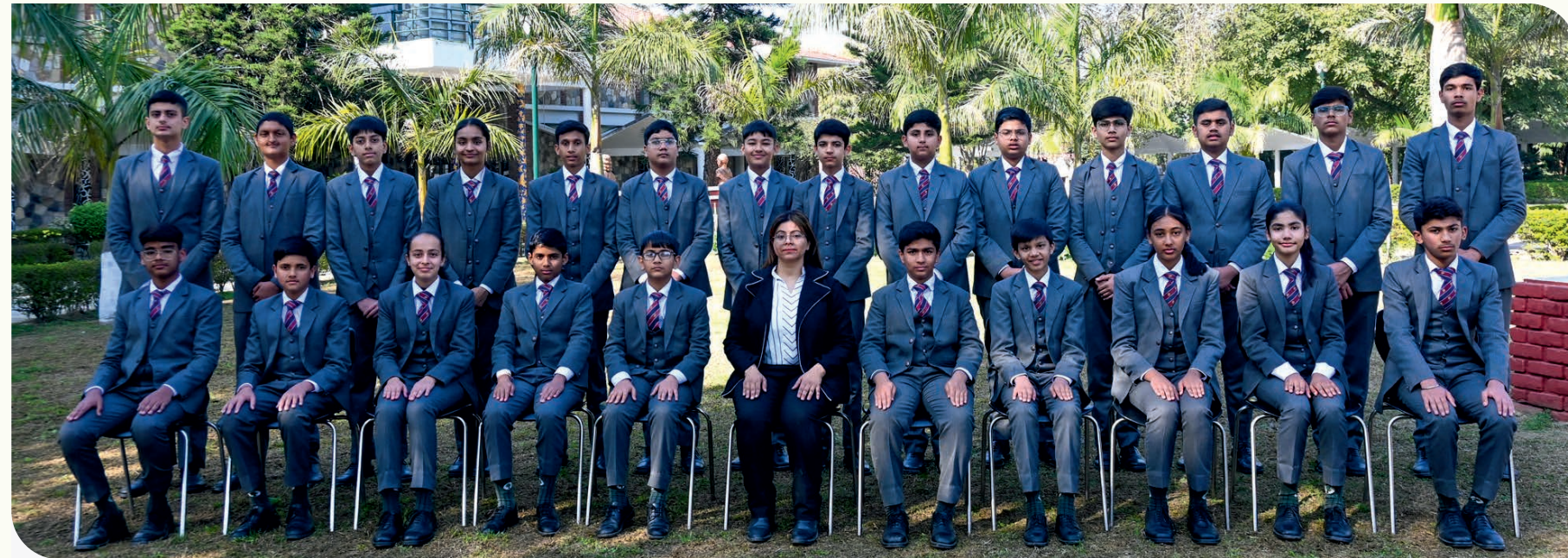

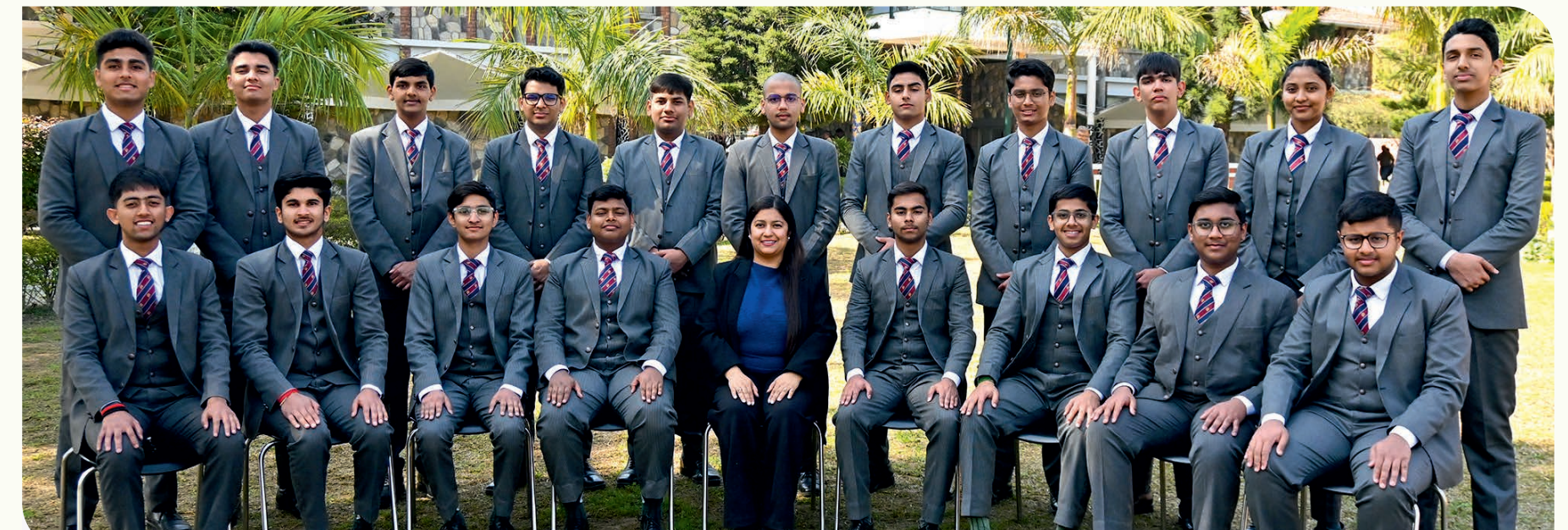

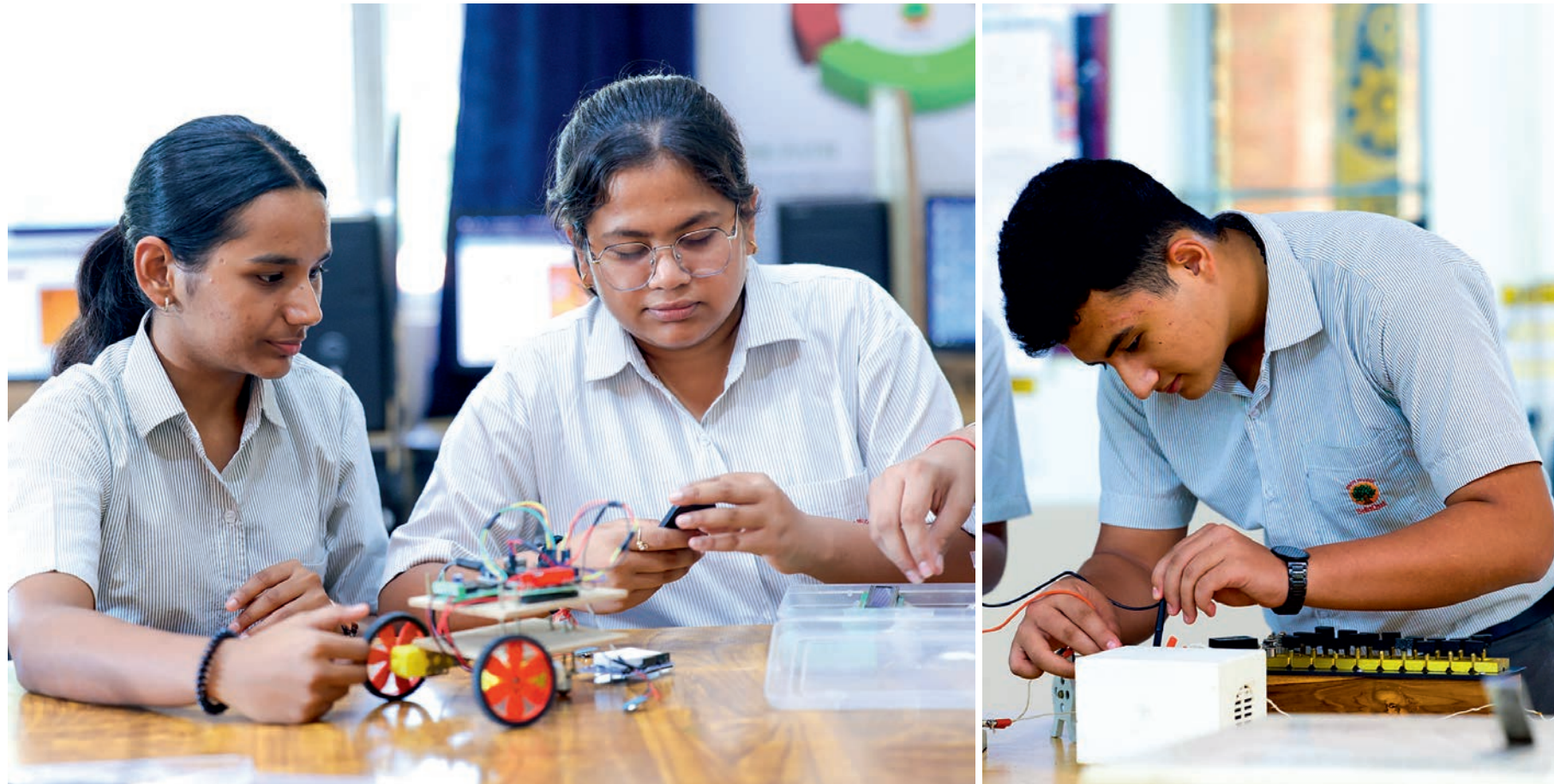
Aeromodelling is an engaging hobby centered around the construction and operation of model aircraft. These meticulously designed replicas imitate the flight characteristics of real airplanes and helicopters, utilizing various power systems, including electric motors for quiet efficiency, internal combustion engines for robust performance, and pneumatic systems leveraging air pressure. Aeromodelling offers not only the thrill of flying but also opportunities for competition in events such as high-speed races and acrobatic maneuvers, appealing to enthusiasts from casual builders to serious competitors.

Our aeromodelling journey included a series of hands-on workshops aimed at imparting in-depth knowledge about aircraft assembly and the essential components involved.

Participants learned the procedure to assemble vital parts of the aircraft, including the wings, fuselage, and tail sections. The workshops also

emphasized correct methods of attaching the engine, servos, and control systems to ensure optimal flight performance. We spent considerable time learning about the functions of different components, such as the wings for lift, the fuselage for housing critical systems, and the tail for maintaining flight stability. This understanding helped us appreciate aerodynamics and how each part contributes to successful flight. A highlight was constructing our own radio-controlled plane, where we gained practical experience by building the frame, installing electronics, and testing the control systems.

Aeromodelling has proven to be immensely rewarding, equipping participants with hands-on knowledge of aviation principles and aircraft construction. Throughout the workshops, we confidently mastered model assembly and honed skills applicable in various technical fields. Building our own RC plane and gaining insights regarding its components significantly enhanced our understanding of aircraft operations. Whether pursued for enjoyment, education, or competition, aeromodelling stands out as a fascinating hobby with numerous benefits.

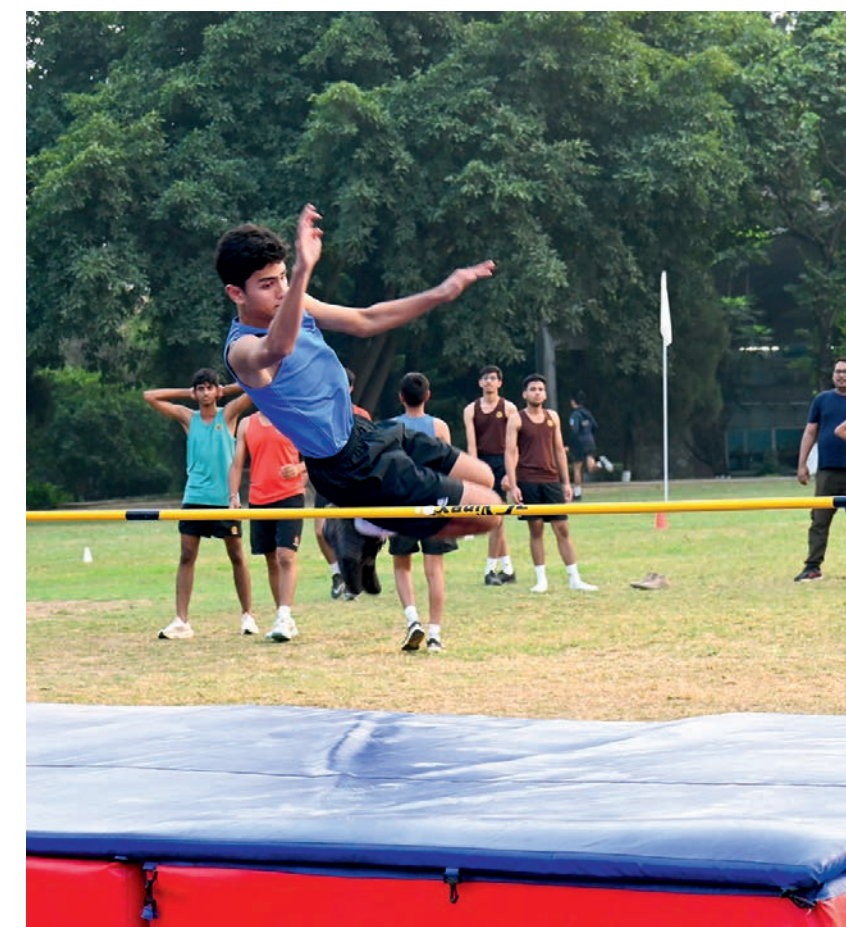
of our students.

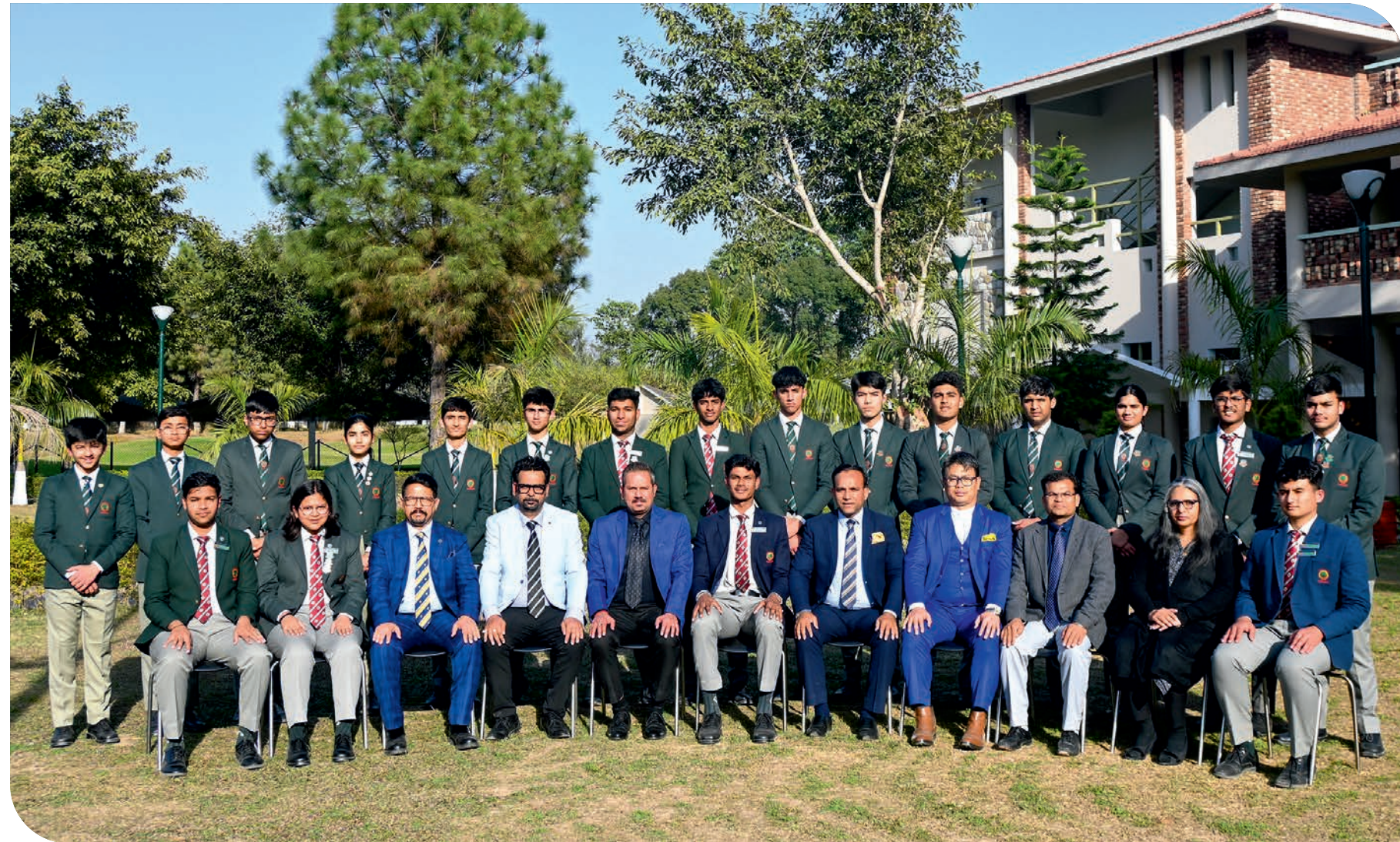

 Life a curse or blessing?!

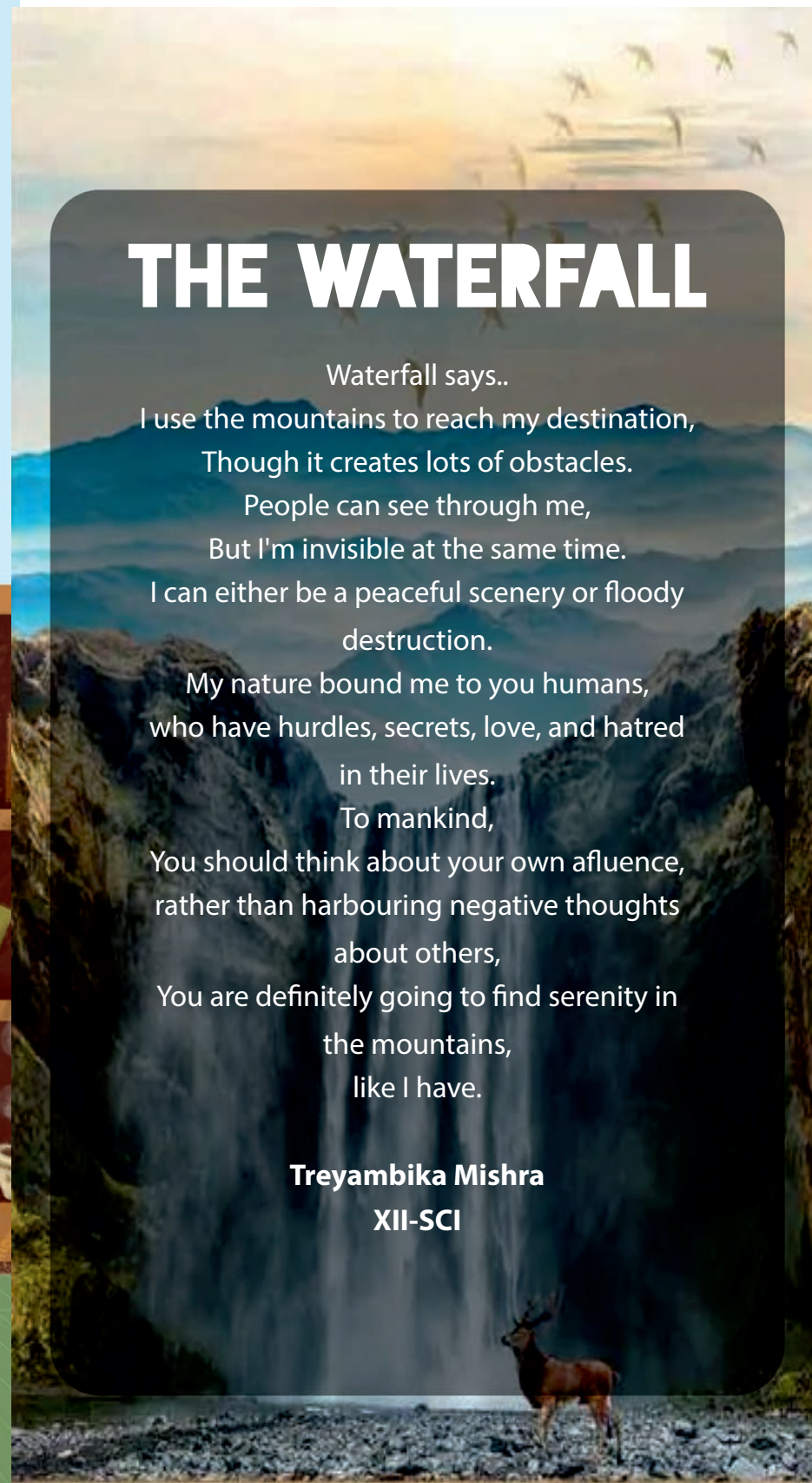

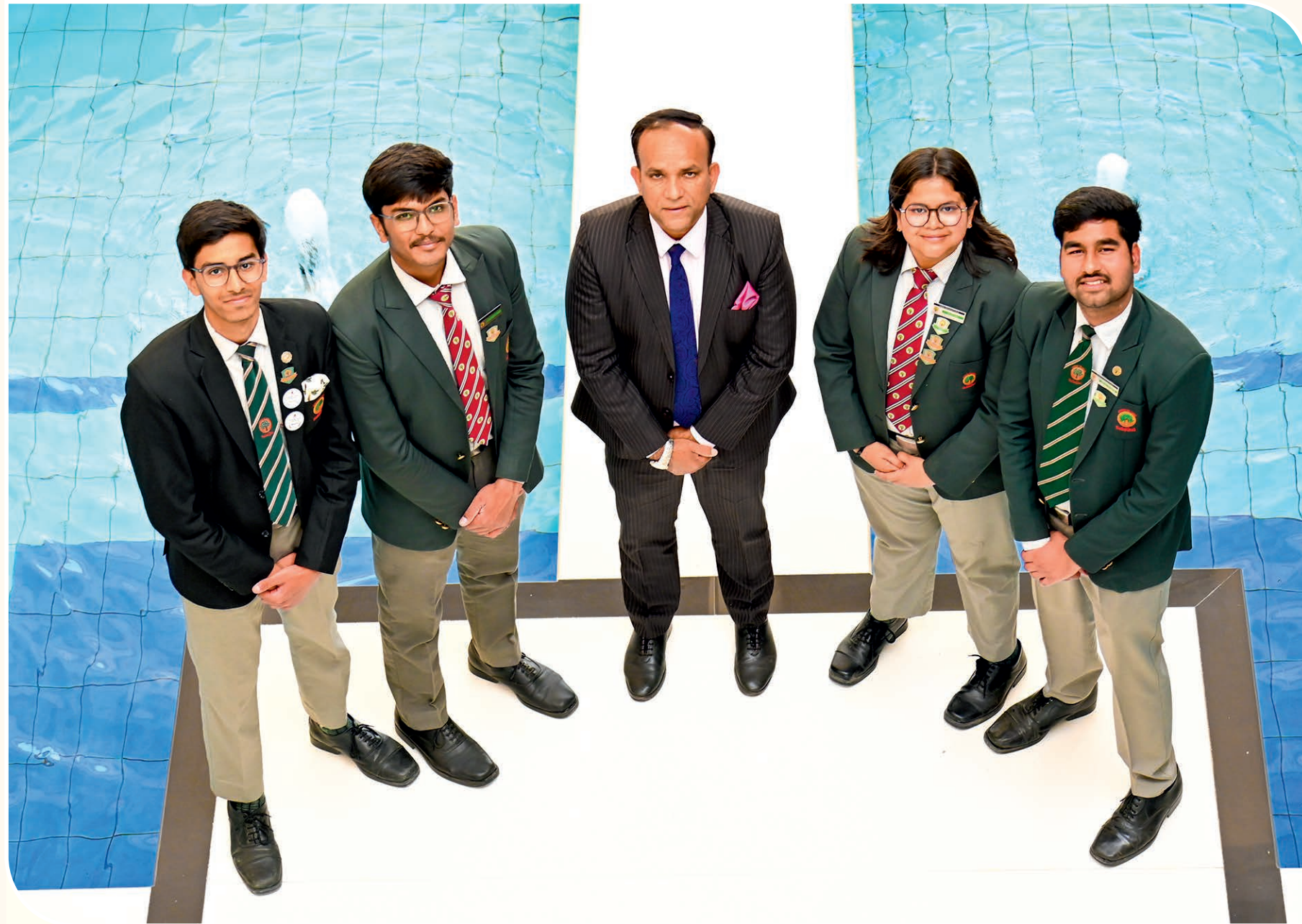

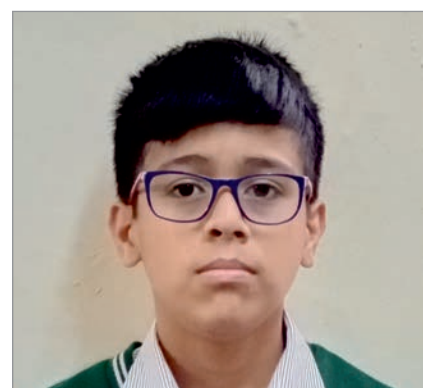
